We have so much to look back on fondly, and even more to look forward to as we head towards the end of 2024. Have a look at these highlights and have a wonderful November!






Age Well at Home Initiative Helping older adults live independently and comfortably in their own homes and communities for longer.

BANK OF CANADA LOWERS INTEREST RATES

The Bank of Canada has lowered its key interest rate to 3.75 per cent, making a 50-basis-point cut for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic. Before, the rate stood at 4.25 per cent. Economists were expecting the central bank to go with a larger than usual cut, compared to the 25-basis-point downgrades made in June, July and September.

CANADIAN DENTAL CARE PLAN REACHES MILESTONE

NEWS AND NOTES FROM PARLIAMENT HILL

<u>Minister LeBlanc launches Call for Applications under</u> <u>National Crime Prevention Strategy</u>

The Honourable Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Public Safety, Democratic Institutions and Intergovernmental Affairs, announced the launch of the application process for funding under the National Crime Prevention Strategy (NCPS). Eligible organizations will be able to apply for funding from November 1st to December 20th, 2024. An estimated \$123.5 million will be available over the next five years.

Organized crime groups and gangs are increasingly recruiting among youth. By investing in prevention, we're meeting young people where they are so that organized crime groups and gangs can't get to them in the first place. This investment will support community-led crime prevention efforts tailored to at-risk and vulnerable youth, particularly Indigenous and racialized youth, youth involved in violence, and youth with repeat contacts with the criminal justice system.

Specifically, funding will be focused on initiatives aimed at stopping crime before it occurs by reducing the risk factors that lead youth to get involved in violent criminal activity, such as gun violence and auto theft.

PASSPORT INFORMATION

A friendly reminder!

Here's what you need to know about passports and travelling abroad.



- You can pick up passport applications at the office in North Bay at 375 Main Street West, or in Temiskaming Shores at 17 Wellington Street North.
- Constituents can take their filled-out applications to Service Canada in North Bay, located at 107 Shirreff Ave suite 102, P1B 7K8, and in New Liskeard at 280 Armstrong St North, POJ 1PO.
- By taking it to Service Canada, constituents are now able to get certified copies of their documents, while experienced Service Canada personnel check over the application. Service Canada will also mail out your passport to the processing centre the same day.
- The average processing time to receive your passport is approximately 20 business days plus Canada Post delivery time.
- For those wishing to renew an adult passport, you have 15 years from the original issue date to apply for a renewed passport.
- We encourage constituents to apply for their passport well in advance of their scheduled trip in case of any delays.
