As part of this program, prescription contraceptive medication and devices will be free, giving over 9 million Canadian women true freedom of choice.


# NATIONAL PHARMACARE PROGRAM

### <u>Federal government launches new \$1.5 billion program to build a new generation of co-op housing</u>

On June 6th, the federal government launched a new Co-operative Housing Development Program to support a new generation of co-op housing in Canada and help make housing more affordable.

For decades, co-ops have provided Canadians with secure, affordable, and community-oriented homes. The new \$1.5 billion program – co-designed with the Co-operative Housing Federation of Canada and other leaders in the co-op sector – will provide loans and contributions to build and grow co-ops across Canada. This is the largest investment to build new co-op housing in the last 30 years.

The program will build thousands of new co-op homes by 2028. Projects that focus on providing homes for those most in need will be prioritized. Co-op housing providers will be able to apply for funding starting on July 15, 2024, and the first intake round will remain open until September 15, 2024. Additional intake opportunities will be announced at a later date. To start preparing an application and to receive updates, please visit the Co-operative Housing Development webpage.

The Co-operative Housing Development Program will help increase the number of affordable homes in Canada and grow the community housing sector faster so that low- and middle-income Canadians have a safe and affordable place to call home. Through investments like this, we are addressing housing pressures across the country, so that future generations have the same opportunity to rent or own a place of their own as generations that came before them.

### **PASSPORT INFORMATION**

#### A friendly reminder!

Here's what you need to know about passports and travelling abroad.



- You can pick up passport applications at the office in North Bay at 375 Main Street West, or in Temiskaming Shores at 17 Wellington Street North.
- Constituents can take their filled-out applications to Service Canada in North Bay, located at 107 Shirreff Ave suite 102, P1B 7K8, and in New Liskeard at 280 Armstrong St North, POJ 1PO.
- By taking it to Service Canada, constituents are now able to get certified copies of their documents, while experienced Service Canada personnel check over the application. Service Canada will also mail out your passport to the processing centre the same day.
- The average processing time to receive your passport is approximately 20 business days plus Canada Post delivery time.
- For those wishing to renew an adult passport, you have 15 years from the original issue date to apply for a renewed passport.
- We encourage constituents to apply for their passport well in advance of their scheduled trip in case of any delays.
