

More than 70,000 Canada Summer Jobs opportunities for youth across Canada

The Government of Canada is creating generational fairness by creating opportunities for young Canadians to get the skills they need for well-paying jobs. Canada Summer Jobs (CSJ) supports this strategy by helping young people to earn money over the summer, while gaining skills and experience.

The Honourable Marci len, Minister for Women and Gender Equality and Youth and the Honourable Arif Virani, Minister of Justice and Attorney General of Canada, highlighted the impact of the CSJ program in creating over 70,000 job opportunities for youth across Canada. This initiative is part of the Government of Canada's ongoing commitment to support young Canadians, making life more affordable and providing them with the skills and experience needed to build a better future.

The CSJ program prioritizes projects that support youth who face barriers to employment. This includes youth with disabilities, Indigenous youth, as well as Black and other racialized youth. By providing all young people with equitable opportunities to develop their skills, Canada Summer Jobs can help them to succeed in the job market.

This year's budget includes a proposed \$200.5 million investment for 2025–26 to continue the Canada Summer Jobs program, further demonstrating the commitment to creating opportunities for young Canadians. These job opportunities have enabled youth to gain valuable work experience, develop essential skills and earn money over the summer in various sectors, including those facing critical labor shortages such as housing construction.

PASSPORT INFORMATION

A friendly reminder!

Here's what you need to know about passports and travelling abroad.



- You can pick up passport applications at the office in North Bay at 375 Main Street West, or in Temiskaming Shores at 17 Wellington Street North.
- Constituents can take their filled-out applications to Service Canada in North Bay, located at 107 Shirreff Ave suite 102, P1B 7K8, and in New Liskeard at 280 Armstrong St North, POJ 1PO.
- By taking it to Service Canada, constituents are now able to get certified copies of their documents, while experienced Service Canada personnel check over the application. Service Canada will also mail out your passport to the processing centre the same day.
- The average processing time to receive your passport is approximately 20 business days plus Canada Post delivery time.
- For those wishing to renew an adult passport, you have 15 years from the original issue date to apply for a renewed passport.
- We encourage constituents to apply for their passport well in advance of their scheduled trip in case of any delays.
