Bank of Canada cuts interest rate to 4.25%

BANK OF CANADA LOWERS INTEREST RATES FOR THE THIRD TIME

The decision, which reduced the benchmark rate by 25 basis points to 4.25 per cent, marked the first time the central bank has cut three times in a row, barring the pandemic, since the height of the global financial crisis in the first quarter of 2009. <u>More</u>


National child-care plan has cut costs, created tens of thousands of new spaces, report says

CANADA'S INFLATION RATE DROPS AGAIN

In its third consecutive cut since June, the Bank of Canada lowered its key interest rate to 4.25 per cent. The decision followed a pattern established earlier this summer when rates were cut to 4.75 per cent in June and 4.5 per cent in July.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM PARLIAMENT HILL

<u>Constructing a wetland in Nipissing First Nation to support vital</u> <u>plant species</u>

Nipissing First Nation has received \$90,000 through the Natural Infrastructure Fund to construct a wetland that can convert nutrient-rich wastewater into environmentally-safe non-potable water, for growing ecologically significant plant species.

Wetlands store carbon; help communities prevent floods, droughts, and adapt to environmental change; improve water quality by removing pollutants; and provide important habitat for fish and wildlife.

Nipissing First Nation is working to increase environmental resilience in the region by growing local plant species. Once installed, the wetland will be capable of filtering contaminants out of wastewater so it can be used to irrigate important and rare pollinator and marsh based plant species. The community aims to become a regional leader in the use of modern green technologies.

"This is an exciting and innovative project! Nipissing First Nation will be able to repurpose wastewater and use it to grow food security in the community and cultivate climate resilience on the land."



PASSPORT INFORMATION

A friendly reminder!

Here's what you need to know about passports and travelling abroad.





- Constituents can take their filled-out applications to Service Canada in North Bay, located at 107 Shirreff Ave suite 102, P1B 7K8, and in New Liskeard at 280 Armstrong St North, POJ 1PO.

By taking it to Service Canada, constituents are now able to get certified copies of their documents, while experienced Service Canada personnel check over the application. Service Canada will also mail out your passport to the processing centre the same day.



The average processing time to receive your passport is approximately 20 business days plus Canada Post delivery time.



For those wishing to renew an adult passport, you have 15 years from the original issue date to apply for a renewed passport.



We encourage constituents to apply for their passport well in advance of their scheduled trip in case of any delays.
