SEXUAL AND REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH FUND



The federal government will increase the cap on insured mortgages to \$1.5 million from \$1 million, effective Dec. 15, which would allow more people to buy a house with a down payment below 20 per cent.

CANADA'S INFLATION RATE DROPS YET AGAIN

Canada's inflation rate decreased to two per cent in August, finally hitting the Bank of Canada's target in its long campaign to cool price growth. Last month's two per cent rate marks the slowest pace of growth since February 2021. The Bank of Canada's preferred core measures of inflation also ticked down a notch.

NEWS AND NOTES FROM PARLIAMENT HILL

<u>Government announces significant new support to help small business owners</u>

Canada's small- and medium-sized businesses keep main streets flourishing across the country, create good-paying jobs, and deliver the dream of entrepreneurship. It is essential that these businesses thrive so they can continue being the bedrock of our communities and our economy.

Today, the Honourable Chrystia Freeland, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance, alongside the Honourable Rechie Valdez, Minister of Small Business, and the Honourable Jean-Yves Duclos, Minister of Public Services and Procurement, announced a comprehensive suite of measures to help small- and medium-sized businesses start up, grow, and thrive.

First, the federal government announced the payment amounts for the new Canada Carbon Rebate for Small Businesses, which will deliver over \$2.5 billion to about 600,000 Canadian businesses before the end of this year. This refundable tax credit will return a portion of the fuel charge proceeds from 2019–20 through 2023–24 to small businesses, in jurisdictions where the federal fuel charge applies. Eligible businesses that filed their 2023 tax return by July 15, 2024, will receive their payment by:

- December 16, 2024, if registered for direct deposit from the Canada Revenue Agency; or,
- December 31, 2024, if receiving payment by cheque.

To ensure all eligible businesses can receive their payments, the government is proposing to extend the deadline for businesses that file their tax return from July 15, 2024, to December 31, 2024. Late filers would receive their payment at a later date, subject to Royal Assent of the required legislation.

PASSPORT INFORMATION

A friendly reminder!

Here's what you need to know about passports and travelling abroad.



- You can pick up passport applications at the office in North Bay at 375 Main Street West, or in Temiskaming Shores at 17 Wellington Street North.
- Constituents can take their filled-out applications to Service Canada in North Bay, located at 107 Shirreff Ave suite 102, P1B 7K8, and in New Liskeard at 280 Armstrong St North, POJ 1PO.
- By taking it to Service Canada, constituents are now able to get certified copies of their documents, while experienced Service Canada personnel check over the application. Service Canada will also mail out your passport to the processing centre the same day.
- The average processing time to receive your passport is approximately 20 business days plus Canada Post delivery time.
- For those wishing to renew an adult passport, you have 15 years from the original issue date to apply for a renewed passport.
- We encourage constituents to apply for their passport well in advance of their scheduled trip in case of any delays.
